SUBJECT: SAFETY PARAMETER DISPLAY SYSTEM (SPDS) IMPLEMENTATION PLAN  
AND PARAMETER SELECTION REPORT

Reference: TAC Numbers 57689 and 57690

By letters dated February 14, May 1, October 4, 1984 and January 14, 1985 you provided your responses to Generic Letter (GL) 82-33, Supplement 1 to NUREG-0737, in relation to your SPDS. Your submittals provided the basis for selection of the parameters to assure their adequacy to assess a wide range of events, the implementation plan (schedules for design, development, installation and operation) as well as the design verification and validation plan.

By letter dated March 4, 1985, we transmitted our Safety Evaluation (SE) which indicated additional information was needed relative to seven variables. You responded to our request by letters dated May 14, 1985 and July 15, 1985. Additional clarification was also provided during a site visit on October 11, 1985.

The enclosed Supplemental Safety Evaluation (SSE) provides the details of our review of the additional information. Based on our initial SE and the enclosed SSE, we have concluded that the Turkey Point Plant SPDS Implementation Plan and Parameter Selection Report are acceptable.

This completes our actions related to the above referenced TAC numbers.
