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

#### TURKEY POINT STATUS REPORT

(April 16 - May 13, 1988)

### 1. Plant Status

Unit 3 was in mode 1. Unit 4 was in mode 5.

### 2. Facility Operations Summary

Unit 3 is operating at 100 percent power and has been on line since March 30, 1988.

Unit 4 is in mode 5, draining to mid-level nozzle.

On April 27, 1988, at 8:08 p.m. the licensee commenced a shutdown of the unit due to increasing reactor coolant system (RCS) leakage and the unit was shutdown by April 28, 1988, 12:29 a.m. The RCS leakage was caused by a pressurizer spray valve. The leak rate increased to 3.1 gpm. The unit remained shutdown to install spool pieces to the ICW piping in preparation for adding an amertap system. The unit is scheduled to restart on May 15, 1988.

# 3. Items of Interest

The independent management appraisal was issued April 15, 1988. The NRC is scheduled to complete its review and assessment of the appraisal by May 20, 1988.

On May 6, 1988 at approximately 2:00 a.m., a security officer performing a patrol on FPL owner-controlled property reported that he was fired upon by a total of five individuals and that he returned the fire. The officer received a powder burn to his left forearm with no other injuries reported. The Dade County Metro Police Department is conducting an investigation into the event. The security officer has taken a polygraph examination on May 9, 1988. It was the polygraph examiner's opinion that the officer truthfully answered the questions concerning the incident. The Metro police completed the ballistics check on a bullet removed from the security officer's truck and it came from the security officer's own gun. Subsequent to this report, the security officer has resigned from his job.

On May 9, 1988, J. Cross became the new Turkey Point Plant Manager. He comes to the site from System Energy Resources, Inc.'s Grand Gulf nuclear plant where he served as Site Director. C. Baker, the previous Plant Manager has accepted a position with FPL's project management in Juno Beach.

F. Southworth has replaced J. A. Labarraque as Technical Department Supervisor and Labarraque will become the Senior Technical Advisor.

The fifth management meeting as required by Order EA 87-85 between the NRC and FPL was conducted on April 22, 1988. The topics of discussion were plant status; Management-on-Shift program; SALP improvements in the areas of engineering, training and security; quality improvement team summary on contaminated floor space; and the status of the technical specifications improvement project.

## 4. NRC Staff Activities During the Period

During the week of April 25, 1988, a Test Program Section, DRS, inspection was conducted in the area of heat tracing procedures and previous open inspection items.

On April 21, 1988, an Enforcement Conference was held on Emergency Preparedness issues. The results of the conference will be issued in the meeting summary.

### 5. Change to Monthly Status Reporting

This report will continue to be issued monthly with the next report due on June 15, 1988.
