The Performance Enhancement Program (PEP) for Turkey Point Units 3 and 4 is the subject of a NRC Confirmatory Order dated August 12, 1986. Section IV of that order discusses the process for relaxing or terminating provisions of the order for good cause. In accordance with these provisions, FPL requests that the remaining portions of Project 1, Task 5.1, Remove Temporary Facilities, be terminated.

Of the original fifty six trailers that were part of the scope of this task, approximately forty have been vacated and removed as the permanent facilities have been completed. The remaining trailers are occupied by groups that were not accounted for in the original scope of Project 1 or are a part of what has become the fossil operating facilities. Accordingly, they should be deleted from the scope of the project. It is our judgement that retaining these facilities on site will not be contrary to the objectives of Project 1 of the Performance Enhancement Project.
