Our letter L-82-497, dated November 10, 1982, identified various surveillance requirements required by our Technical Specifications which we did not intend to implement during the Steam Generator Repair Outage. This was due to the fact that fuel was removed from the reactor vessel during the length of the outage. We inadvertently left out a commitment to test all the affected equipment prior to reloading fuel into the reactor.

The purpose of this letter is to state our commitment to test the affected equipment and to perform the surveillances required by Technical Specifications referenced in L-82-497 prior to reloading fuel into the reactor and to resume normal surveillance frequencies at that time.
