SUBJECT: Exercise Report for the November 7, 1984, Exercise of  
the Offsite Radiological Emergency Preparedness (REP)  
Plans for the Turkey Point Nuclear Power Plant

Attached are two copies of the Exercise Report for the November 7, 1984, partial participation joint exercise of the offsite REP plans for the Turkey Point Nuclear Power Plant. Although offsite jurisdictions were eligible for a biennial exercise schedule, they elected to participate in the regularly scheduled annual exercise. The local offsite jurisdictions that fully participated in the exercise were Dade and Monroe counties located in the 10-mile plume emergency planning zone. The State of Florida confined their exercise participation to the Emergency Operations Facility and the Emergency News Center.

The exercise report was submitted by Region IV of the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA). There were no deficiencies observed during the exercise that require a schedule of corrective actions. Deficiencies which were noted in the June 1983 exercise have been corrected and the corrective actions were satisfactorily demonstrated during the November 1984 exercise. Areas identified for improvements included that of obtaining additional radiological equipment and training in the proper operation and use of the radiological equipment. They are discussed in the section II entitled "Detailed Discussion."

FEMA Region IV staff will furnish a copy of this exercise report to the State of Florida and follow up on the areas identified for improvements.

Based on the results of the November 1984 exercise, there continues to be reasonable assurance that appropriate protective measures can be implemented by offsite jurisdictions around the Turkey Point Nuclear Power Plant to protect the health and safety of the public in the event of a radiological emergency.
