SUBJECT: NOTICE OF VIOLATION
(NRC INSPECTION REPORT NOS. 50-250/86-40 AND 50-251/86-40)

This refers to the Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) inspection conducted by Orysia M. Masnyk on September 28-29, 1986. The inspection included a review of activities authorized for your Turkey Point facility. At the conclusion of the inspection, the findings were discussed with those members of your staff identified in the enclosed inspection report.

NRC concerns relative to the inspection findings were discussed by J. Nelson Grace, Regional Administrator, NRC, Region II, with C. M. Wethy, Site Vice President in an Enforcement Conference held on October 1, 1986. The violation described in the enclosed Notice of Violation involved a failure to implement additional compensatory measures at a vital area when pathways to the area from the protected area were created.

Areas examined during the inspection are identified in the report. Within these areas, the inspection consisted of selective examinations of procedures and representative records, interviews with personnel, and observation of activities in progress.

The inspection findings indicate that certain activities appeared to violate NRC requirements. The violation, references to pertinent requirements, and elements to be included in your response are described in the enclosed Notice of Violation.

In addition to the need for corrective action regarding the specific matters identified in the enclosed Notice, we are concerned about the implementation of your Security Program that permitted this situation to develop. Consequently, your response should describe those particular actions taken or planned to improve the effectiveness of your program. Specifically we are concerned about your lack of initiative in improving the security program or in resolving identified problems.

Additionally, we would like to take this opportunity to correct a misunderstanding in your October 2, 1986 memo to us. We did not request you to perform an assessment of the vital areas to ensure there were no unidentified

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concerns: We recommended this as an appropriate course of action, an action we would hope you would want to implement to ensure the soundness of your current barriers and program.

In accordance with 10 CFR 2.790(d) and 10 CFR 73.21, safeguards activities and security measures are exempt from public disclosure; therefore, the enclosures to this letter, with the exception of the report cover page which presents a nonexempt summary, will not be placed in the NRC Public Document Room.

The responses directed by this letter and its enclosures are not subject to the clearance procedures of the Office of Management and Budget as required by the Paperwork Reduction Act of 1980, PL 96-511.
