In accordance with 10 CFR 50.90, Florida Power & Light (FPL) requests that you amend, on an emergency basis, Appendix A of Facility Operating License DPR-31 (Turkey Point Units 3 and 4 Technical Specifications) to allow the emergency containment filter system surveillance testing, required by T.S.4.7.1.1 and 4.7.1.2.a, to be performed during the Unit 3 refueling outage scheduled to begin March 15, 1987. The proposed changes are shown on the attached Technical Specification pages. These surveillance requirements are now required to be satisfied prior to February 18, 1987. The basis for our request and the reason for the emergency are included in Attachment 2. Should this request not be granted, plant procedure requires the unit to be in cold shutdown (Mode 5) in order to perform the required surveillance. Due to the potential for significant neutron dose, ALARA radiological considerations do not make performance of this test during power operations a reasonable consideration.

It has been determined that the proposed amendment does not involve a significant hazards consideration pursuant to 10 CFR 50.92. A no significant hazards consideration determination is attached.

In accordance with 10 CFR 50.91(b)(1), a copy of this proposed amendment is being forwarded to the State Designee for the State of Florida.

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

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


