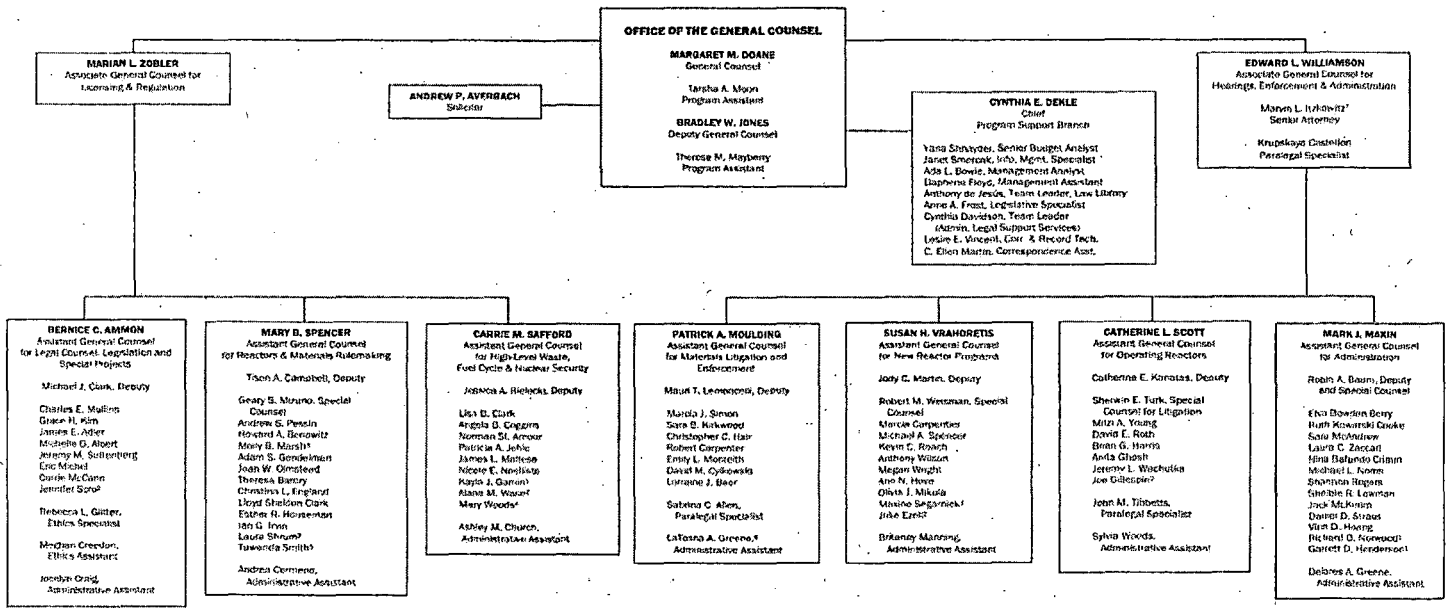
- Exemption 1: The withheld information is properly classified pursuant to an Executive Order protecting national security information.

DIVISIONAL RESPONSIBILITIES

Legal Counsel, Legislation and Special Projects Division

Functions:

This Division assists the General Counsel in providing legal advice and assistance to the Commission in the review of significant adjudicatory decisions, on the implementation of government ethics regulations, and in the development of the Commission's legislative program, including the drafting of proposed legislation for Commission consideration. The Legal Counsel Division also advises on the legal and policy implications of legislation referred to the Commission for comment and on the implementation of the Freedom of Information Act, Privacy Act, Federal Advisory Committee Act, Paperwork Reduction Act, Congressional Review Act, and the Government in the Sunshine Act. It provides legal advice and assistance to the Office of Investigations and the Office of Commission Appellate Adjudication; provides advice to the Office of Information Services on matters related to the electronic storage and transmission of documents, and advises the Office of the Chief Financial Officer on user fee issues.

Typical Services:

Represents the NRC in federal court litigation, especially in the courts of appeals (other than cases those involving personnel matters).

Advising the Office of Investigations on the conduct of its investigations, including the issuance of subpoenas, preparing NRC responses to subpoenas that are issued to NRC employees to assist in discovery in lawsuits to which the NRC is not a party (*Touhy requests*), and managing NRC discovery responses, including litigation holds, in government cases not directly involving the NRC.

Drafting legislation, agency views on pending legislation, and analyzing newly enacted legislation and newly issued executive orders. Assisting the agency in its dealings with Congress and serving as liaison to OMB on legislative matters.

Administering the agency's ethics program, including providing ethics training, reviewing financial disclosure reports, and providing ethics advice to current and former NRC employees. Advising employees on whether political activities are permitted under the Hatch Act.

Advising the Office of International Programs on export, import, and nonproliferation matters, including the negotiation of international treaties, and agreements on these subjects. Preparing Commission adjudicatory orders on export and import licensing matters.

Advising the Secretary of the Commission and the Commission on the disposition of requests for hearings and other adjudicatory matters before an Atomic Safety Licensing Board is appointed, and reviewing, when requested, draft orders written by the Office of Commission Appellate Adjudication.

Advising on electronic government issues and the implementation of federal information and records laws, including the Freedom of Information Act, the Privacy Act, the handling and disclosure of proprietary or confidential business information submitted to the NRC, and copyright law.

Advising on administrative law statutes, including the Administrative Procedure Act, the Government in the Sunshine Act, the Congressional Review Act, the Paperwork Reduction Act, and the Federal Advisory Committee Act.

Advising the Chief Financial Officer on user fee matters.

Advising the agency on implementation of the Price-Anderson Act.

Monitoring and analyzing for the agency activity that might be preempted by the Atomic Energy Act or other Federal statutes administered by the NRC or that might lead to federal regulation under those same statutes.

Advising the General Counsel on whether to seek to initiate claims under the Program Fraud Civil Remedy Act for small dollar fraud against the NRC.

Advising the agency on issues pertaining to NRC's independence from the Executive Branch.

Advising the Secretary and the Commission on matters pertaining to the *Internal Commission Procedures*.

Completing special projects assigned by OGC management or the Commission.
