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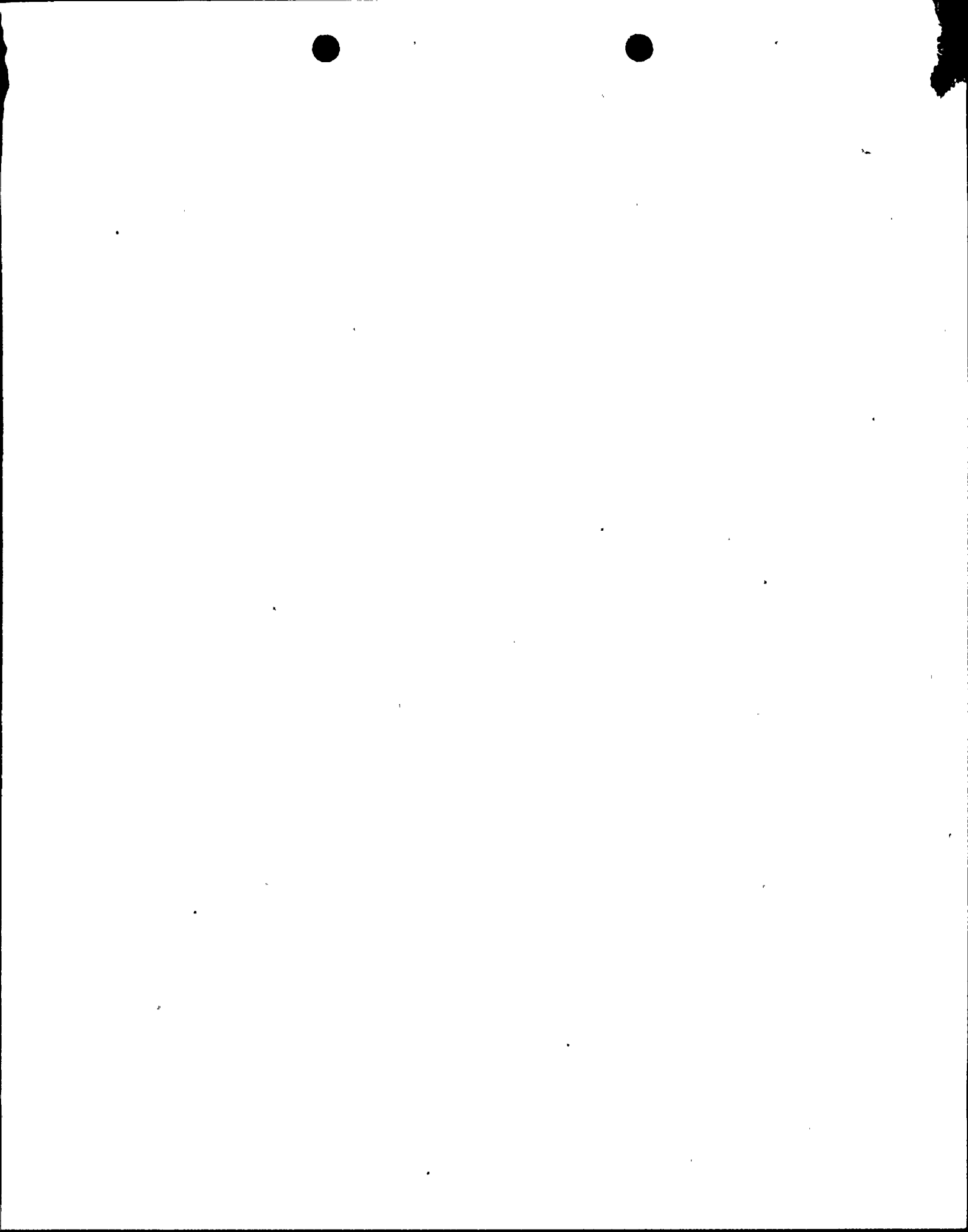

Subject: PREPARATIONS FOR HURRICANE FLOYD

At 5:00 p.m. on September 14, 1999, Hurricane Floyd was located approximately 200 miles east-southeast of St. Lucie Nuclear Plant and with the center estimated near latitude 26.5 North and longitude 77.4 West. The storm is moving northwest at 12 mph. Maximum winds are near 140 mph.

Florida Power and Light Company (FP&L) is continuing to prepare for the approach of the hurricane at St. Lucie, including implementation of procedures for severe weather preparations. Turkey Point has exited the NOUE at 5:10 p.m. The licensee continues to be in an Unusual Event for St. Lucie 1 and 2. St. Lucie Unit 1 is at 300 degrees F and establishing shutdown cooling in preparation for a scheduled refueling outage and Unit 2 is at approximately 35 percent power. The licensee is continuing to monitor the progress of the hurricane.

At St. Lucie, three resident inspectors are onsite monitoring activities. A Region II manager is at the FP&L Emergency Operations Facility (EOF) in Miami. The Region II State Liaison Officer is available to be dispatched to the Florida Emergency Operation Center (EOC) in Tallahassee. Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) Situation Reports can be obtained at: www.fema.gov. The FEMA Region IV Regional Operations Center (ROC) in Atlanta is fully activated.

The NRC continues to follow the licensees' activities associated with this effort.
