

AMENDMENT TO INDEMNITY AGREEMENT NO. B-103
AMENDMENT NO. 3

Effective _____, Indemnity Agreement No. B-103, between Carolina Power and Light Company and North Carolina Eastern Municipal Power Agency and the Nuclear Regulatory Commission, dated October 28, 1985, as amended, is hereby further amended by modifying Article I, paragraph 9 to read as follows:

"The radioactive material means source, special nuclear and byproduct material which (1) is used, was used or will be used in, or is irradiated, was irradiated or will be irradiated by, the nuclear reactor licensed under NPF-63, or (2) was used in, or was irradiated in the nuclear reactors licensed under DPR-23, DPR-62 and DPR-71 and subsequently is transported to the site of the nuclear reactor licensed under NPF-63 for the purpose of storage, or (3) which is produced as the result of the nuclear reactor licensed under NPF-63.
