Dear Mr. Denton,

I am writing as a mother of two children and a concerned citizen living within twenty miles of the Shearon Harris Nuclear Power Plant. The current emergency evacuation plan presented by CP and L is unworkable and unacceptable to the citizens of Chatham County. I am asking that CP and L not be granted a license to operate the plant.

After the Three Mile Island accident the evacuation zone was increased to ten miles. In light of the Chernobyl accident it has been shown that even eighteen miles is an inadequate distance of evacuation.

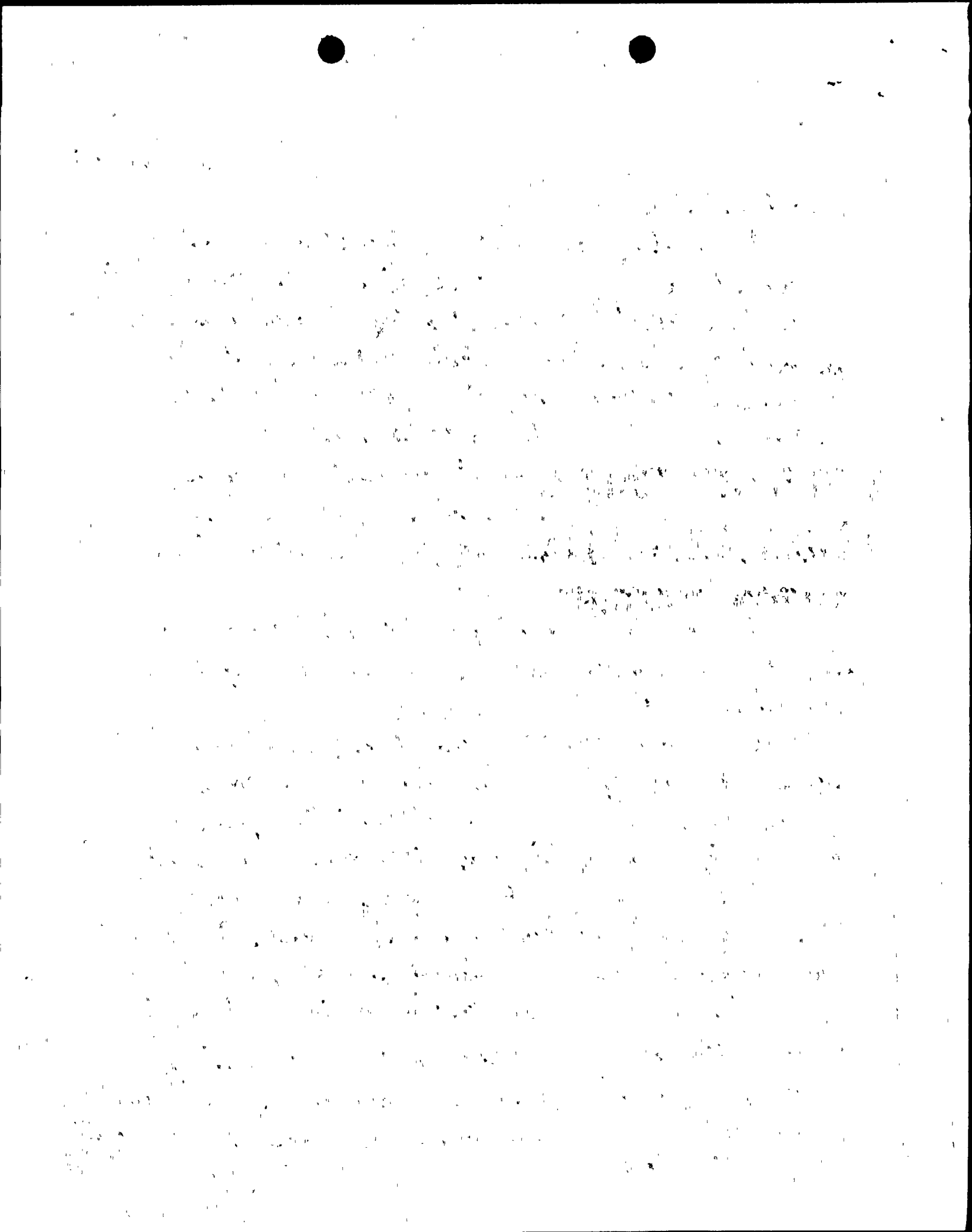
I talked with a school principal of one of our elementary schools within the ten mile evacuation zone. She assured me that the plan described to her by the CP and L officials was totally unrealistic, taking into account her twenty-five bus routes, and the complete atmosphere of panic among the children and their parents who will stop at nothing to pick up their children at school.

CP and L has petitioned your agency to be exempt from carrying out a full scale evacuation exercise. For what reason should CP and L be allowed this exemption? Doesn't CP and L's Brunswick plant have one of the worst safety records? The lives of my children will be threatened if CP and L is granted a license to operate the Shearon Harris plant. For the sake of our children, do not allow CP and L to open the plant.
