MEMORANDUM FOR: United States Nuclear Regulatory Commission License Number 12-00722-07 Radiation Safety Officer (Mr. Michael Kurth)

SUBJECT: Radiation Safety Officer Delegation of Authority

Mr. Michael Kurth, you have been appointed Radiation Safety Officer (RSO) for United States Nuclear Regulatory Commission License Number 12-00722-07. In accordance with the license conditions you are responsible for ensuring the safe use of radioactive materials. You are to manage the Radiation Protection Program by identifying radiation protection problems, initiate, recommend, and/or provide corrective actions, verify that corrective actions are implemented, stop unsafe activities, and ensure compliance with regulations. You are delegated the authority necessary to meet those responsibilities, including prohibiting the use of radioactive materials by employees who do not meet the necessary requirements to maintain radiation safety. You are required to notify management if staff does not cooperate and does not address radiation safety issues. In addition, you are free to raise issues with the United States Nuclear Regulatory Commission at any time. It is estimated that you will spend 40-60 hours per year conducting radiation protection activities.
