
MOTION TO SHOW CAUSE

The purpose of this motion is to show cause as to why this case should not be dismissed without prejudice, pursuant to Federal Rule of Civil Procedure 4(m) and Local Civil Rule 83.23 for failure to prosecute, as requested by the Court. The Plaintiff had made two good faith attempts to forward the Summons to the Court, so that it could be Docketed, before being served upon the Defendant. The Court had not received the Summons the first time, so the Plaintiff had mailed the Summons again, via certified mail. (A copy of the proof of mailing is available upon request.) The Court did receive the second mailing, and the Plaintiff did in turn, finally receive a copy of the Docketed Summons back from the Court on 20-Mar-2018. Since the Plaintiff is now in possession of a copy of a Docketed Summons, he will be able to affect service. In light of this, the Plaintiff hereby requests a (60) day continuance in this matter, so that he may serve the Summons upon the Defendant.
