This letter is in response to your March 13, 2018 communication to The Charlotte Hungerford Hospital (the "Hospital"). For ease of reference, we have included below the questions you have asked in your communication along with our response.

To confirm our position, no indirect transfer of control occurred. As indicated in the letter from the Hospital dated February 23, 2018, previously provided to NRC, the Hospital has experienced a change in its corporate member (the "Organizational Change") effective January 1, 2018 (the "Effective Date"). Specifically, Hartford HealthCare Corporation, a Connecticut non-stock corporation, became the sole corporate member of the Hospital on the Effective Date.

The Organizational Change is a change in the corporate parent of the Hospital, which did not result in any assets or operations being transferred from the Hospital, and will have no impact on the Hospital's legal name, federal tax identification number, location, or direct supervising personnel. The Hospital maintains ownership and control over the assets and services involved in the Hospital's NRC-regulated activities.

1. Since this action involves an indirect transfer of control, the February 23, 2018 letters should have been signed by senior management of Charlotte Hungerford Hospital and Hartford Healthcare Corporation. In your reply to this letter, please have correspondence signed by senior management of both entities, and please confirm that they abide by all statements and commitments made in the February 23, 2018 letters.

The undersigned, on behalf of their respective entities, agree to abide by all statements and commitments made in the February 23, 2018 letter.

2. Please confirm that transaction has already occurred, with an effective date of January 1, 2018.

The Organizational Change was effective as of January 1, 2018.

3. Please describe any change in members on Charlotte Hungerford Hospital's Board of Directors.

As a result of the Organizational Change, Hartford HealthCare Corporation appointed two individuals to the Hospital's Board of Directors.

- Please submit pre- and post- transaction organizational charts showing the corporate structure of the license holder and its parent companies.



- Please indicate if there will be any changes in the training program.  

There will be no changes in personnel or duties that relate to the licensed program. There will be no changes in the location, facilities, equipment, radiation program use, possession, waste management, or other procedures that relate to the licensed program.
- Please confirm that equipment calibrations for survey instrumentation, dose calibrators, well counters, electrometers, etc. were up to date at the time of the transfer.  

The status of the Hospital facilities, equipment, and radiation safety program will not change. All equipment calibrations for survey instrumentation, dose calibrators, well counters, electrometer, etc. were up to date as of January 1, 2018
- Please confirm that there was no contamination at the time of the transfer, and that the transferee accepted the facility "as is" on the date of transfer.  

There was no contamination as of January 1, 2018 and the change of control occurred with the facility accepted "as is" on the date of transfer.
- Please confirm that all records concerning the safe and effective decommissioning of the facility will be transferred to the transferee or to NRC, as appropriate. These records include documentation of surveys of ambient radiation levels and fixed and/or removable contamination, including methods and sensitivity.  

There was no decommissioning of equipment or facilities as a result of the transaction. Should there be a decommissioning, all records concerning the safe and effective decommissioning of the facility will remain with the Hospital as the Hospital only experienced a change in ownership and not a transfer of operations.

9. Please confirm that both transferor and transferee agree to transferring control of the licensed material and activity, and the conditions of transfer, and that the transferee has been made aware of any open inspection items and its responsibility for possible resulting enforcement actions.


As no transfer of control occurred, the parties to the Organizational Change did not agree to transfer control of the licensed material and activity. The Hospital does not seek to transfer its license. All records will remain with the Hospital.

10. Please confirm that the transferee will abide by all constraints, conditions, requirements, representations, and commitments of the transferor or that the transferee will submit a complete description of the proposed licensed program.

As in the past, Charlotte Hungerford Hospital will continue to abide by all constraints, conditions, requirements, representations, and commitments set by the NRC program. The Hospital does not seek to transfer its license. All records will remain with the Hospital.
