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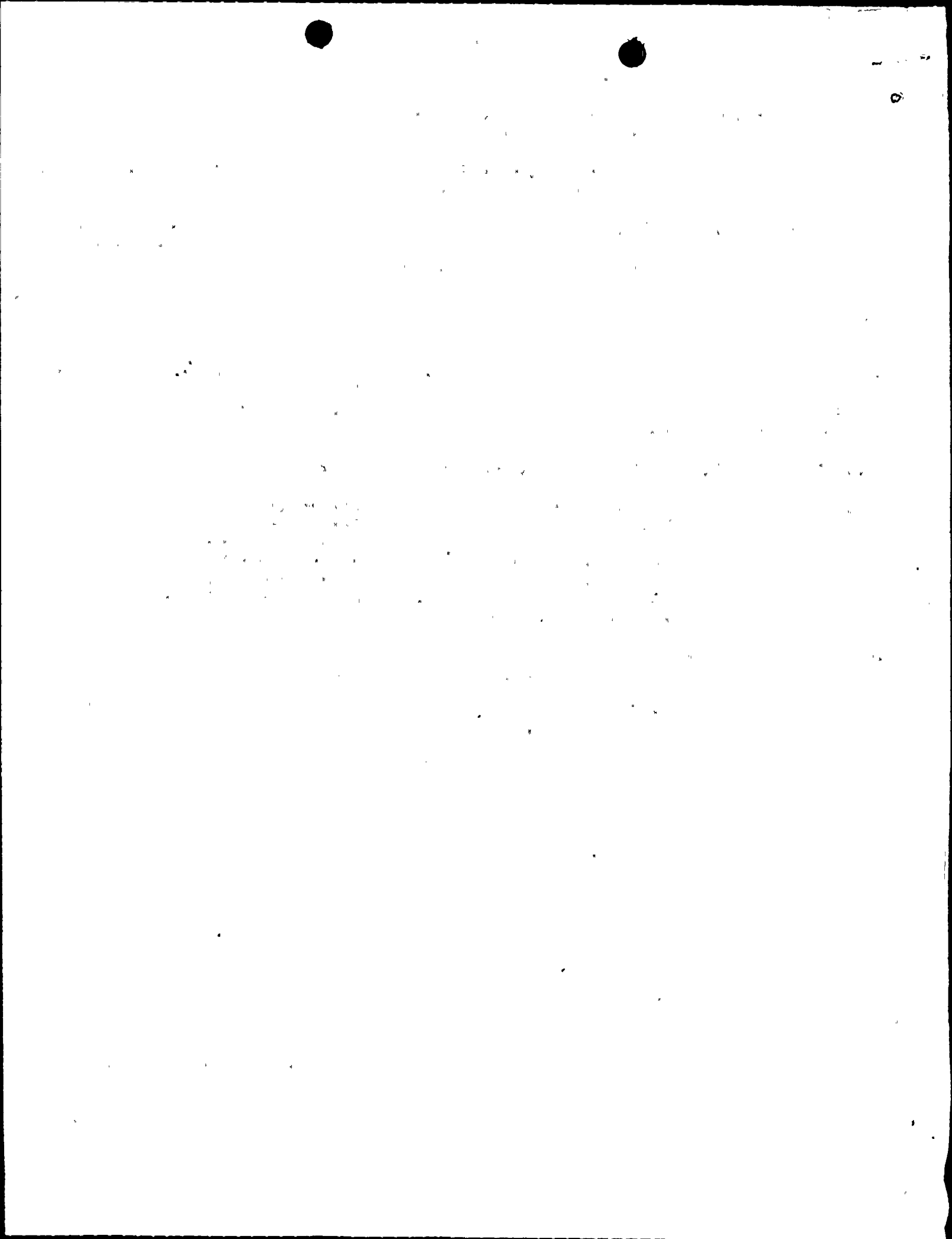
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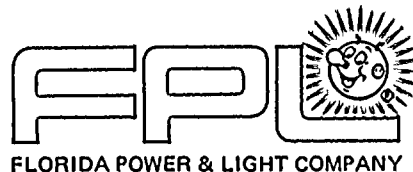

Re: Conditions of License N, O, and P
St. Lucie Unit No. 1, Docket No. 50-335

By Amendment No. 19 to the Operating License for St. Lucie Unit No. 1, the Nuclear Regulatory Commission granted a one-time extension to the surveillance frequency for resistance temperature detector tests, snubber functional tests, and Class 1E underground cable tests in response to FPL's request dated August 22, 1977 (L-77-256), as supplemented by our letters dated September 2, 1977 (L-77-276), and November 1, 1977 (L-77-338). The amendment extended the surveillance intervals for these tests to allow the testing to be performed during the first scheduled refueling outage. The completion of these tests was required as Conditions of License N, O, and P, respectively.

The surveillances required by Technical Specifications 4.3.1.1.3 (Reactor Protective Instrumentation Response Time Tests), 4.7.10.1.3 (snubber functional tests), and 4.8.1.1.3 (Class 1E underground cable tests) have been completed. Documentation relating to these surveillances is available onsite for review by NRC personnel. It is accordingly requested that Conditions N, O, and P be deleted from Enclosure 1 as having been satisfied.
