ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW OF TURKEY POINT NUCLEAR PLANT,
UNITS 3 AND 4 SUBSEQUENT LICENSE RENEWAL APPLICATION

Dear Chairman Cypress:

The U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) is conducting a review of the environmental effects of renewing the operating licenses for Turkey Point Nuclear Plant, Units 3 and 4 (PTN). PTN is operated by Florida Power & Light Company and is located in Miami-Dade County, Florida, approximately 25 miles south of the city of Miami (see Enclosure 1). Florida Power & Light submitted an application for the subsequent renewal of PTN operating licenses in a letter dated January 30, 2018, pursuant to Title 10 of the *Code of Federal Regulations* Part 54 (10 CFR Part 54).

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As part of the NRC's license renewal review, a site-specific supplement to the "Generic Environmental Impact Statement for License Renewal of Nuclear Plants," NUREG-1437, is prepared in accordance with 10 CFR Part 51, the NRC's environmental protection regulations. These regulations also implement Section 102(2) of the National Environment Policy Act of 1969, as amended (NEPA). In accordance with 36 CFR 800.8(c), the NRC intends to comply with Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act of 1966, as amended (NHPA), through the NEPA process. Accordingly, the NRC staff is inviting parties who may be interested in the proposed action to consult with the NRC staff on this matter. The purpose of this letter is to initiate Section 106 consultation with the Miccosukee Tribe of Indians of Florida under NHPA.

In the context of NHPA, NRC staff has determined that the area of potential effects (APE) for this subsequent license renewal is the area at the power plant site and its immediate environs that may be impacted by ongoing routine maintenance and operational activities during the license renewal term (see Enclosure 2). The APE may extend beyond the immediate PTN environs if Florida Power & Light Company maintenance and operational activities affect offsite historic properties (see Enclosure 3). This determination is made irrespective of ownership or control of the lands of interest.

Pursuant to 10 CFR 51.28 and 36 CFR 800.2(c), the NRC wishes to ensure that Indian Tribes that might have an interest in any potential historic properties in the APE are afforded the opportunity to identify their concerns. The NRC invites you to provide input to the scoping process relating to the NRC's environmental review of the subsequent license renewal application. 

Area Map, 50-mile radius






Turkey Point Site Area Map




