

## RECEIPT OF PETITION FOR DIRECTOR'S DECISION UNDER 10 CFR §2.206

Notice is hereby given that, by mailgram dated December 11, 1986, and by supplemental petition dated January 20, 1987, Citizen Action for a Safe Environment (CASE) requested the Nuclear Regulatory Commission to require Virginia Electric and Power Company to take a number of actions before the Surry facility restarts. The bases for the requested action were: (1) the December 9, 1986 pipe-break accident at the facility, (2) an alleged ongoing pattern of violations in areas such as plant operations, surveillance, fire protection, radiological controls, emergency preparedness, security and safeguards, quality assurance and administrative control of quality assurance at the station, (3) alleged deficiences in welder certification and welding quality assurance at the station, and (4) alleged inadequacies in the siren warning system and evacuation plans for the Surry plant.

The petition is being treated pursuant to 10 CFR §2.206 of the Commission's regulations and, accordingly, appropriate action will be taken on the request within a reasonable time.
