Dear Mr. Johnson:

Enclosed is Amendment No. 118 to your Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) Material License No. 21-01430-01 in accordance with your request.

Also enclosed are Amendments Nos. 25 and 5 for your NRC Materials License Nos. 21-32431-01 and 21-16339-01, respectively, terminating each of those licenses.

As requested in letter dated March 23, 2018, we have added two locations of use. The locations of use were listed on the terminated NRC licenses noted above. The licensees were held by Sparrow Ionia Hospital and Sparrow Carson Hospital and have been terminated concurrently with the issuance of the aforementioned Amendment No. 118.

Finally, in correspondence dated March 23, 2018, you indicated that you wish to remove and release the Hot Lab and HDR Treatment Room at 1215 E. Michigan Ave., Lansing Michigan for unrestricted use.

The NRC staff has reviewed your final status surveys. Based on its review, the staff has concluded that all licensable radioactive material has been removed from the Hot Lab and HDR Treatment Room and residual radioactive material attributable to licensed activities does not exceed current NRC criteria. Based on these conclusions no further remediation or actions with respect to NRC regulated material is required for this area of use and it is suitable for unrestricted use.

Please review the enclosed document carefully and be sure that you understand all conditions. If there are any errors or questions, please notify the U.S. NRC, Region III office at (630) 829-9887 so that we may provide appropriate corrections and answers.

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You will be periodically inspected by NRC. Failure to conduct your program in accordance with NRC regulations, license conditions, and representations made in your license application and supplemental correspondence with NRC will result in enforcement action against you. This could include issuance of a notice of violation, or imposition of a civil penalty, or an order suspending, modifying or revoking your license as specified in the General Statement of Policy and Procedure for NRC Enforcement Actions. Since serious consequences to employees and the public can result from failure to comply with NRC requirements, prompt and vigorous enforcement action will be taken when dealing with licensees who do not achieve the necessary meticulous attention to detail and the high standard of compliance which NRC expects of its licensees.

NRC's Regulatory Issue Summary (RIS) 2005-31 provides criteria to identify security-related sensitive information and guidance for handling and marking of such documents. This ensures that potentially sensitive information is not made publicly available through ADAMS, the NRC's electronic document system. Pursuant to NRC's RIS 2005-31 and in accordance with Title 10 of the *Code of Federal Regulations* (CFR) Section 2.390, the enclosed license document is exempt from public disclosure because its disclosure to unauthorized individuals could present a security vulnerability.
