Delegation of Authority Memo

To: Mary Stiker, REP Coordinator, IDHS
From: Bryan J. Langley, Executive Director, IDHS
Subject: Delegation of Authority

You, Mary Stiker, have been appointed Radiation Safety Officer (RSO) and are responsible for ensuring the safe use of radiation. You are responsible for managing the Radiation Protection Program in regards to safe use of radiation; identifying radiation protection problems, initiating, recommending, or providing corrections actions; verifying implementation of corrective actions; stopping unsafe activities; and ensuring compliance with regulations. You are hereby delegated the authority necessary to meet those responsibilities, including prohibiting the use of byproduct material by employees who do not meet the necessary requirements and shutting down operations where justified to maintain radiation safety. You are required to notify management if staff does not cooperated and does not address radiation safety issues. In addition, you are free to raise issues with the Nuclear Regulatory Commission at any time. It is estimated that you will spend five (5) hours per week conducting radiation protection activities.
