Dear Mr. Fowler:

By letter to the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC), dated February 12, 2018 (Agencywide Documents Access and Management System (ADAMS) Accession No. ML18045A440), NAC International (NAC) submitted an affidavit dated February 12, 2018, executed by Mr. George Carver, Vice President, NAC, requesting that the information contained in the following proprietary documents for the Model No. NAC-MPC [Multi-Purpose Cask] package be withheld from public disclosure pursuant to Title 10 of the *Code of Federal Regulations* (10 CFR) Part 2, Section 2.390:

- NAC Calculation 12414-2007, Revision 1, "Connecticut Yankee VCC [Vertical Concrete Cask] Structural Analysis," for Connecticut Yankee NAC-MPC system (Enclosure 4 of the NAC letter dated February 12, 2018).

The NAC affidavit dated February 12, 2018, stated that the submitted information should be considered exempt from mandatory public disclosure for the following reasons:

- a. Information that discloses a process, method, or apparatus, including supporting data and analyses, where prevention of its use by competitors of NAC, without license from NAC, constitutes a competitive economic advantage over other companies.
- b. Information that, if used by a competitor, would reduce their expenditure of resources or improve their competitive position in the design, manufacture, shipment, installation, assurance of quality or licensing of a similar product.
- c. Information that reveals aspects of past, present, or future NAC customer-funded development plans and programs of potential commercial value to NAC.

We have reviewed your application and the material in accordance with the requirements of 10 CFR 2.390 and, on the basis of your statements, have determined that the submitted information sought to be withheld contains proprietary commercial information and should be withheld from public disclosure.

Therefore, the version(s) of the submitted information marked as proprietary will be withheld from public disclosure pursuant to 10 CFR 2.390(b)(5) and Section 103(b) of the Atomic Energy Act of 1954, as amended.

Withholding from public inspection shall not affect the right, if any, of persons properly and directly concerned to inspect the documents. If the need arises, we may send copies of this information to our consultants working in this area. We will, of course, ensure that the consultants have signed the appropriate agreements for handling proprietary information.

If the basis for withholding this information from public inspection should change in the future such that the information could then be made available for public inspection, you should promptly notify the NRC. You also should understand that the NRC may have cause to review this determination in the future, for example, if the scope of a Freedom of Information Act request includes your information. In all review situations, if the NRC makes a determination adverse to the above, you will be notified of the date of public disclosure, in advance, which will be a reasonable time thereafter.
