Enclosed is Amendment No. 19 to your NRC Materials License No. 21-13783-02 in accordance with your request.

In your letters dated July 11, 2016 and September 13, 2016, you requested that three locations of use on your license be decommissioned and released. You provided a facility decommissioning report to support your request. The NRC staff has reviewed all of this information, including the final status surveys. Based on its review, the staff has concluded that all licensable radioactive material has been removed from the facilities at 947 Pine Street, Sebewaing, Michigan, 159 South Howard Avenue, Croswell, Michigan, and 891 Peninsular Street, Caro, Michigan. Residual radioactive material attributable to licensed activities does not exceed current NRC criteria. Therefore, you may release 947 Pine Street, Sebewaing, Michigan, 159 South Howard Avenue, Croswell, Michigan, and 891 Peninsular Street, Caro, Michigan for unrestricted use.

Please note that, as requested, we have left the location at 891 Peninsular Street, Caro, Michigan listed on the license until such time as you would like to remove it. Please note that if you choose to use or store licensed material at that location in the future, you will need to have it formally decommissioned again by the NRC.

Please review the enclosed documents carefully and be sure that you understand all conditions. If there are any errors or questions, please notify the U. S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, Region III office at (630) 829-9887 so that we can provide appropriate corrections and answers.

You will be periodically inspected by NRC. Failure to conduct your program in accordance with NRC regulations, license conditions, and representations made in your license application and supplemental correspondence with NRC will result in enforcement action against you. This could include issuance of a notice of violation, or imposition of a civil penalty, or an order suspending, modifying or revoking your license as specified in the General Statement of Policy and Procedure for NRC Enforcement Actions. Since serious consequences to employees and the public can result from failure to comply with NRC requirements, prompt and vigorous enforcement action will be taken when dealing with licensees who do not achieve the necessary meticulous attention to detail and the high standard of compliance which NRC expects of its licensees.
