On June 20, 2018, the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) completed a security inspection at your V.C. Summer Nuclear Station, Unit 1. The NRC inspectors discussed the results of the inspection with Mr. Robin R. Haselden, General Manager Organizational Development & Effectiveness, and other members of your staff. The results of this inspection are documented in the enclosed report.

The inspection examined activities conducted under your license as they relate to security and compliance with the Commission's rules and regulations and with the conditions of your license. The inspectors reviewed selected procedures and records, observed activities, and interviewed personnel.

The NRC inspectors documented one finding of very low security significance (Green) in this report. This finding involved a violation of NRC requirements. The NRC is treating this violation as non-cited violations (NCVs) consistent with Section 2.3.2.a of the Enforcement Policy.

If you contest this violation or the significance, you should provide a response within 30 days of the date of this inspection report, with the basis for your denial, to the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, ATTN: Document Control Desk, Washington DC 20555 0001; with copies to the Regional Administrator, Region II; the Director, Office of Enforcement, U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, Washington, DC 20555 0001; and the NRC resident inspector at the V.C. Summer Nuclear Station.
