**Comments:** Potential Long-term Options for the Mock Adversary Force used for NRC-conducted Force-on-Force Inspections:

- Maintain the current construct with the NEI CAF and NextEra/Entergy JCAF.
- Allow licensees to maintain their own corporate/fleet adversary force.
- Return to a National CAF managed by a third-party.
- NRC establishes a contract with a third party vendor.
- NRC establishes an MOA with a government organization.

Evaluation Criteria for Potential Options:

- Selection and training of the mock adversary force team
- Consistency and reliability regarding tactical application
- Sustainability by NRC and by licensees
- Impact on licensee activities
- Knowledge transfer
- Conflict of interest
