Re: . Problem Nuclear Reactor at Turkey Point Plant

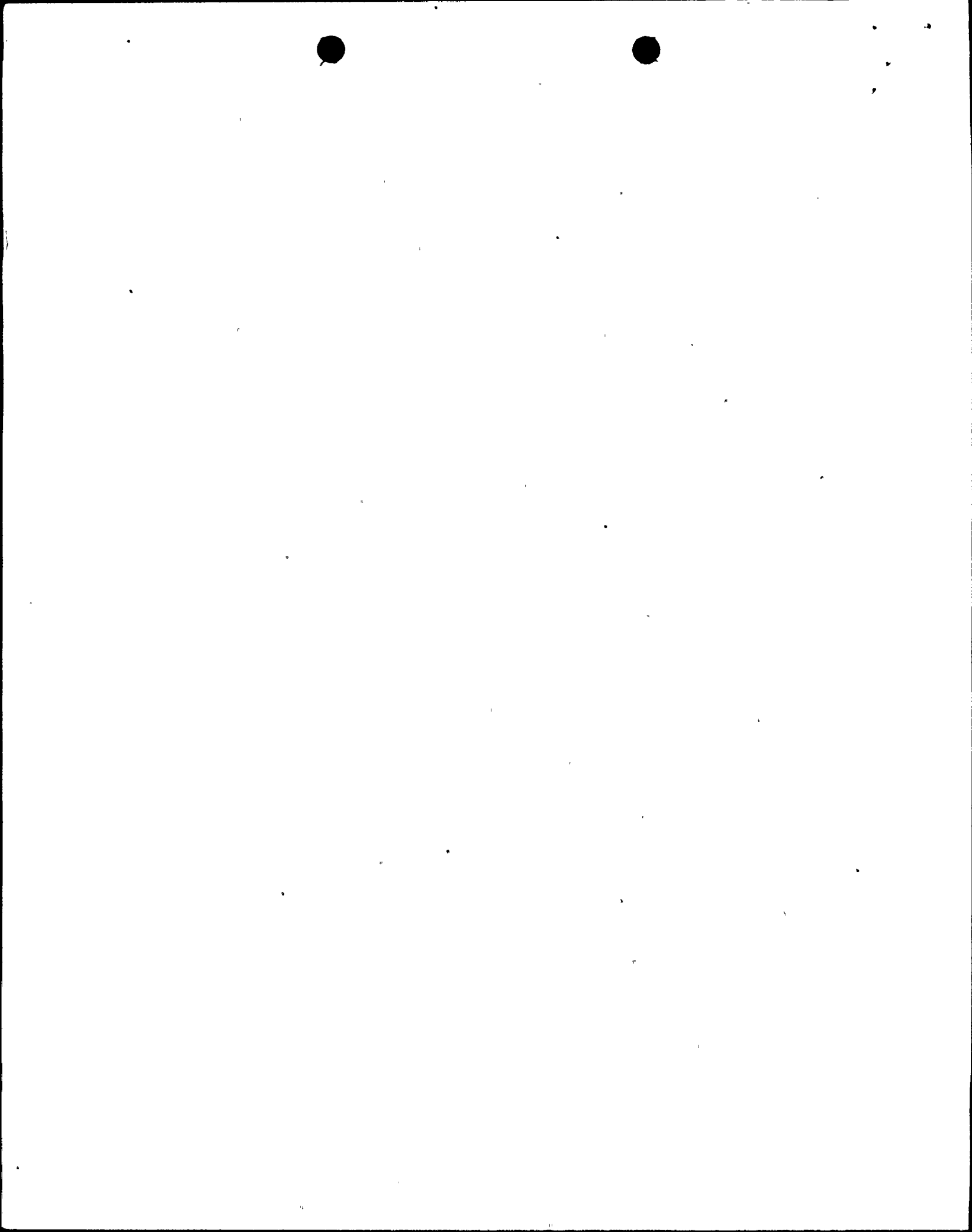
Dear Mr. Kammerer:

We waited about two to three months for copies of reports as I requested, regarding the problem at the nuclear power plant at Turkey Point, operated by Florida Power & Light Co. To date we have not received any copies of any reports of your visits to the Turkey Point Plant. We now request in this certified letter, a copy of the reports of what you found on every day that you visited the Turkey Point plant.

We also would like to know the dates you have visited since you have written your letter to me, and inspected the Turkey Point plant, and on what dates prior to writing your letter of February 24.

The employee who used to work at Florida Power & Light Co. has explained this problem and the lack of safety precautions on the part of Florida Power & Light Co.


We now notice from the newspaper that Florida Power & Light has instituted a law suit against Westinghouse for approximately \$50 million or more in Federal Court to make the necessary repairs. This article appeared in the Miami Herald May 12. This article assures that there is no danger. I doubt their assurance and I believe your inspections did reveal the severe problem that exists.

We now request a copy of your reports. We expect your cooperation and we do state in the event we do not receive it from the Nuclear Regulatory Commission we shall go into Federal Court and demand it.

Our Office of Inspection and Enforcement advised me that the most recent inspections of the Turkey Point site were conducted on January 31 - February 3 and February 14 - 17, 1978, by inspectors for the NRC Region II Office in Atlanta, Georgia. These inspections were part of the NRC's regular inspection program.
