
Dear Sir or Madam:

This is a Freedom of Information Act request pursuant to 5 U.S.C. § 552(a)(3) and 10 C.F.R. § 9.23. I am requesting the documents described in the following:

All documents that refer or relate to any legislative packages, draft legislative packages, or other materials prepared subsequent to February 2, 1999, that address proposed legislation to allow the NRC to recover the generic costs associated with spent fuel storage from the Nuclear Waste Fund, including, but not limited to, documents generated by, submitted to, or from (1) the NRC, and (2)(i) either House of Congress, (ii) any congressional committee or subcommittee, (iii) any individual member of either House of Congress, (iv) any staff members of individual members of either House of Congress, or (v) any staff members of any such committee or subcommittee. The legislative packages and proposed legislation referred to above are those referenced in "Staff Requirements – SECY-98-260 – FY 1999 Fee Rulemaking", dated February 2, 1999, from Annette Vietti-Cook (Secretary of the NRC) to James Funches (NRC Chief Financial Officer) and Karen Cyr (NRC General Counsel).

I would appreciate your prompt response within ten working days of the receipt of this request, as provided by the Freedom of Information Act and the NRC regulations and policies.
