To whom it may concern:

This is a request under the Freedom of Information Act. I hereby request copies of all records containing the following information:

- Records relating to any Nuclear Materials License issued for Yuma Proving Ground by the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Agency
- Records relating to licensing and/or approval of the use and/or testing of the M28/M29 Davy Crockett Nuclear Weapon System
- Records relating to licensing and/or approval of the use and/or testing of the M101 spotting round for the M28/M29 Davy Crockett Nuclear Weapon System
- Records relating to licensing and/or, approval of the use of any other weapon or weapon system at Yuma Proving Ground between 1955 and 1965

As the FOIA requires, please release all reasonably segregable nonexempt portions of documents.

In order to help to determine my status to assess fees, you should know that I am an individual seeking information for personal use and not for commercial use. I am seeking this information to help establish my VA

claim for service connected disability incurred during my military duties at Yuma Proving Ground in 1964. The M28/M29 Davy Crockett Nuclear Weapon System and M101 spotting round were tested at Yuma Proving Ground and I believe I was exposed to ionizing radiation from these activities.

I request a waiver of all fees for this request. Disclosure of the requested information to me is in the public interest because it is likely to contribute significantly to public understanding of the operations or activities of the government and is not primarily in my commercial interest. I believe there is a large number of Veterans, such as myself, who may have been exposed to the types of hazardous substances and activities at Yuma Proving Ground which are the subject of this request and that they may have contracted medical conditions related to that exposure. In addition, the community in and around Yuma Proving Ground should be aware of these past activities so they can assess the current risks from them and the information should be of general historical interest as relates to Yuma Proving Ground.

If you do not grant my waiver of fees, I am willing to pay fees for this request up to a maximum of \$50. If you estimate that the fees will exceed this limit, please inform me before processing my request.
