Dear Mr. Hanson:

On August 3, 2018, the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) completed a security inspection at your Clinton Power Station and the NRC inspectors discussed the results of this inspection with Mr. Stoner and other members of your staff. The results of this inspection are documented in the enclosed report.

The inspectors documented one NRC-identified finding of very low security significance (Green) in this report. This finding involved a violation of NRC requirements. The NRC is treating this violation as a Non-Cited Violation consistent with Section 2.3.2.a of the Enforcement Policy.

One cross-cutting aspect was assigned to the above finding in the area of Human Performance – Field Presence. Specifically, leaders are commonly seen in the work areas of the plant observing, coaching, and reinforcing standards and expectations. Deviations from standards and expectations are corrected promptly [H.2].

If you contest the violation or significance of the Non-Cited Violation, you should provide a response within 30 days of the date of this inspection report, with the basis for your denial, to the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, ATTN: Document Control Desk, Washington, DC 20555 0001; with copies to the Regional Administrator, Region III; the Director, Office of Enforcement; and the NRC resident inspector at the Clinton Power Station.

If you disagree with a cross-cutting aspect assignment in this report, you should provide a response within 30 days of the date of this inspection report, with the basis for your disagreement, to the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, ATTN: Document Control Desk, Washington, DC 20555-0001; with copies to the Regional Administrator, Region III; and the NRC resident inspector at the Clinton Power Station.
