Good morning,

This meeting was 2:04:29 long but somebody has incorrectly listed its "Duration" as 3h 30m on the NRC web page.

At 1:28 I believe I heard the NRC staff being told why NRC inspection is necessary, even if the licensees do their own self-assessment. If anyone recalls that Tokyo Electric Power Company Holdings, Inc. apparently did not do any more than their own self-assessment at their Fukushima Dai ichi site, the need for adequate REGULATOR inspections should be clear.

At 1:51:19 I heard an astute comment identifying a submitted but yet incomplete response. This type of performance cannot be accepted. If they could not finish the job, the least they could have done was identify the untimeliness and request a delay OR identify the untimeliness and provide the best guess available at that time. I feel that the lack of urgency killed that Southern Company "clean coal" Kemper County plant in Mississippi and almost killed the two new Vogtle plants under construction. The answers given on FLEX equipment use, county and town emergency response, and operator action relative to security drills was incomplete (as I heard it, anyway.)

The SORCA comment made at 2:00:00 was COMPLETELY missed by ALL NRC staff present in the meeting room. It would be very informative to buy a copy of "Fukushima, The Story of a Nuclear Disaster". Start reading two paragraphs up from the bottom of page 211 to the end of the chapter at page 221. Absolutely do not miss reading the second full paragraph down on page 213. Could I also note that the SORCA accident only lasts for 48 hours, (p. 215), and does not "include calculations of land contamination and the associated economic consequences", (p. 214)?
