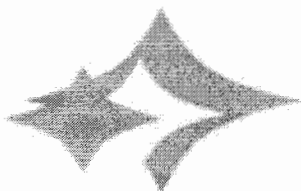

Subject: Delegation of Authority for Radiation Safety Officer of NRC License 24-01143-06

You, Kimberly Bradley Prescott, M.S. have been appointed Radiation Safety Officer (RSO) and are responsible for ensuring the safe use of radiation. You are responsible for managing the Radiation Protection Program; identifying radiation protection problems; initiating, recommending or providing corrective actions; verifying implementation of corrective actions; stopping unsafe activities; and ensuring compliance with regulations. You are hereby delegated the authority necessary to meet those responsibilities; including prohibiting the use of byproduct material by employees who do not meet the necessary requirements and shutting down operations where justified to maintain radiation safety. You are required to notify management if the staff does not cooperate and does not address radiation safety issues. In addition, you are free to raise issues with the Nuclear Regulatory Commission at any time. It is estimated that you will spend needed time per week conducting radiation protection activities. After initial inspection and program development, this activity should require four hours per week to conduct RSO activities.
