Dear Ms. Vega Velez:

By letters dated August 28, 2018, September 20, 2018, and October 26, 2018, RHN Scott Memorial Hospital, LLC (Licensee) submitted to the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) a Request for Consent to License Transfer of NRC Materials License No. 13-26500-01. Based on the information provided, we understand that as a result of a planned merger transaction between LifePoint Health, Inc. (and its subsidiaries including the Licensee) and RegionalCare Hospital Partners Holdings, Inc. d/b/a RCCH Healthcare Partners (RCCH), control will be transferred to RCCH. We further understand that this transfer will not result in any change to the licensed materials, persons using the licensed material, locations of use of licensed material, or persons responsible for the licensee's radiation safety program as authorized on License No. 13-26500-01.

Based on the above understandings and as more fully detailed in the enclosed NRC staff's Safety Evaluation Report which documents the NRC staff's review of the request, we have no objection to the proposed transfer. Please note that you will need to notify us promptly, in writing, after the transaction has been finalized and include a signed copy of the agreement confirming completion of the transaction. Also, please verify the correct name of the hospital on your NRC license. With this information, we can issue an administrative amendment to your NRC license to reflect the transaction. Also, please ensure that the hospital name listed on the NRC license is as stated in the requests. If this planned sale has not been consummated within 30 days of the date of this letter, please notify us in writing. 
