Dear Mr. Botti:

Enclosed is Amendment No. 2 to your NRC Material License No. 21-32787-01 in accordance with your request.

This amendment only changed the mailing address on your license and the address in Condition No. 10 was not changed. We only used your letter dated September 17, 2018, for this amendment and were unable to use the letter dated September 4, 2018, as it lacked specificity.

This amendment was prepared using our new Web Based Licensing System (WBL). This has resulted in changes to your license including the deletion of Condition Nos. 13 and 14, as they appeared on Amendment No. 1 and the addition of ADAMS accession numbers to the documents listed in Condition No. 13 to Amendment No. 2. Your subsequent Conditions have been renumbered as a result.

10 CFR Part 71, while no longer referenced by Condition on your license, is now included by reference in the Preamble language at the top of page 1 of your license.

We also changed Condition No. 13.A., to correct the identity of your "application dated February 17, 2010" to "letter dated January 27, 2010."

Please review the enclosed document carefully and be sure that you understand all conditions. If there are any errors or questions, please notify the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, Region III office at (630) 829-9887 so that we can provide appropriate corrections and answers.

This could include issuance of a notice of violation, or imposition of a civil penalty, or an order suspending, modifying or revoking your license as specified in the General Statement of Policy and Procedure for NRC Enforcement Actions.

Since serious consequences to employees and the public can result from failure to comply with NRC requirements, prompt and vigorous enforcement action will be taken when dealing with licensees who do not achieve the necessary meticulous attention to detail and the high standard of compliance which NRC expects of its licensees.
