This letter is in response to your email dated March 21, 2019 requesting that Camden-Clark Memorial Hospital Corporation ("CCMHC") submit a request for U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission ("NRC") approval of its affiliation with West Virginia United Health System ("WVUHS"). CCMHC holds the NRC License. CCMHC hereby provides the following information as described in Appendix E to NUREG-1556, Volume 15 in response to your request as set forth below:

1. Describe any planned changes in the organization, including but not limited to, transfer of stocks or assets and mergers, change in members on Board of Directors, etc. Provide the new licensee name, mailing address, and contact information, including phone numbers. Clearly identify when the amendment request is due to a name change only.

Response

On August 31, 2010, Camden-Clark Health Services, Inc. ("CCHS") entered into an affiliation agreement with West Virginia United Health System ("Agreement"), pursuant to which, as of March 1, 2011, WVUHS became the sole corporate member of CCHS. CCHS was, prior to that date, and continues to be the sole member of CCMHC, which corporate structure was unaffected by the Agreement. CCMHC has not sold or transferred any assets or stock and has not merged with WVUHS, or any other entity. No changes in the members on CCMHC's Board of Directors occurred as a result of the Agreement. CCMHC has continued through the present to be a private, non-profit West Virginia Corporation which maintains and exercises full control and authority over its day-to-day operations.

2. Describe any changes in personnel or duties that related to the licensed program. Include training and experience for new personnel and any changes in the training program.

Response

There have been no changes to personnel. The Radiation Safety Officer for the activities authorized by the NRC License has remained the same – Daniel A. Berkley.

3. Describe any changes in the location, facilities, equipment, radiation safety program, use, possession, waste management, or other procedures that related to the licensed program.

Response

There have been no changes in location, facilities, equipment or procedures that relate to the licensed program. There will be no changes in the name of the licensee. The only change is the sole member of CCHS – West Virginia United Health System, Inc.

4. Describe the status of the licensee's facilities, equipment, and radiation safety program, including any known contamination and whether decontamination will occur prior to transfer. Include the status of calibrations, leak tests, area surveys, wipe tests, training, quality control, and related records.

Response

There have been no changes in the status of facilities, equipment and/or radiation safety program.

5. If current decommissioning funding plans (DFP) will be changes as a result of the transfer, the revised DFP should be submitted. CCMHC maintains that it is a private, non-profit West Virginia Corporation which has retained and exercises full control and authority over its day-to-day operations, including, but not limited to, the activities and materials governed by the NRC License. To the extent that the NRC determines, however, that there has been a change in control as that term is defined in NRC regulations, CCMHC and WVUHS agree to transferring control of the licensed material and activity, and the conditions of transfer. CCMHC has made WVUHS aware of any open inspection items and its responsibility for possible resulting enforcement actions.

8. Confirm that the transferee will abide by all constraints, conditions, requirements, representations, and commitments of the transferor or that the transferee will submit a complete description of the proposed licensed program.

Response

WVUHS will abide by all constraints, conditions, requirements, representations and commitments of CCMHC.

9. The transferee, in the case of fuel cycle facilities, shall provide documentation showing that it is financially qualified to conduct normal operations. This information can be in the form of income statements and balance sheet forecasts.
