As explained in our first interim response to your request, dated April 13, 2018, items 4-20 of your request duplicate the records, or groups of records, that are described in items 75-94 of a prior request that you submitted (NRC-2018-000096). Although we have issued eight interim responses to NRC-2018-000096, those items remain open and we are continuing to process your request for those items. As such, as will not be addressing these same items in this request. In interim response #1, we addressed the record identified in item 1 (the reprisal study) and one record responsive to item 2 (the transmittal memo). In interim response #2, dated January 7, 2019, we addressed the remaining records responsive to item 2 (background material related to the development of the reprisal study).

In this third, and final, response, we address the records pertaining to the development of the ACRS External Hazards Working Group [WG] Report, including all internal and external communications. The draft versions of the WG Report, as well as internal deliberations that substantively discuss the contents of the draft versions of the WG Report, between or among WG members and/or ACRS staff, have been withheld on the basis of FOIA exemption 5 and the deliberative process privilege. Portions of the draft reports (including appendices) consisting of Critical Energy/Electric Infrastructure Information (CEII) have also been withheld on the basis of FOIA exemption 3, in conjunction with 16 U.S.C. 824o-1(d), and FOIA exemption 7(F).
