SUBJECT: INVITATION FOR SECTION 106 CONSULTATION FOR THE PROPOSED

RELOCATION OF NORTHEAST CHURCH ROCK MINE SITE WASTE TO THE

CHURCH ROCK MILL SITE (DOCKET NUMBER: 40-8907)

## Dear Governor Vallo:

The U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) received a license application from United Nuclear Corporation (UNC), a wholly owned, indirect subsidiary of the General Electric Company (GE) by letter dated September 24, 2018, to amend its NRC license (SUA-1475) to excavate approximately 1 million cubic yards of mine waste from the Northeast Church Rock Mine Site and dispose of it at the adjacent mill site in Gallup, New Mexico (the proposed action). The NRC determined that the application contained sufficient detail to begin its detailed review on December 21, 2018 (Agencywide Documents Access and Management System [ADAMS] Accession Number ML19007A126). NRC issued a formal acceptance letter to GE on March 7, 2019 (ADAMS Accession Number ML19044A592). A map showing the location of the proposed action in McKinley County, New Mexico, is enclosed (Enclosure 1).

An Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) will be prepared in accordance with the regulatory provisions in Title 10 of the *Code of Federal Regulations* (10 CFR) Part 51, "Environmental Protection Regulations for Domestic Licensing and Related Regulatory Functions," which implement the requirements of the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) of 1969, as amended. In accordance with 36 CFR 800.8, "Coordination with the National Environmental Policy Act," the NRC staff will use the NEPA process to comply with its obligations under Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act (NHPA) of 1966, as amended. As stated in NRC's *Federal Register* notice (84 FR 2935), the EIS will include analyses of potential impacts to historic and cultural resources.

The NRC staff invites your Tribe to participate as a consulting party under Section 106 of the NHPA and to assist in the identification and evaluation of historic properties that may be affected by UNC's proposed action and in the development of proposals to address adverse effects that may be identified during the evaluation process.

We would ask that you indicate whether you would like to participate as a consulting party by completing the enclosed Tribal Response Form (Enclosure 2). In order to realize the benefits of early engagement on historic and cultural resources under the NHPA Section 106 consultation process, we would ask that you return the Tribal Response Form as soon as possible,

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especially if you would like to participate as a consulting party. Please note that according to NRC policy, correspondence provided to the NRC, including emails, may be made publicly available. Therefore, the NRC recommends that the Tribe avoid including any information that tribal officials do not want to be publicly disclosed (e.g., personal email addresses). The NRC staff can also be contacted directly to discuss concerns about the confidentiality of information that may be provided to the NRC.
