(Violations and Corrective Actions) 1. 10 CFR 20.1801 requires, in part, that the licenses shall secure from unauthorized removal or access licensed materials that were stored in controlled or restricted areas. Contrary to the above, on February 21, 2019, Wetzel County Hospital did not secure from unauthorized removal or access licensed materials that were stored in controlled or restricted areas. Specifically, a Nuclear Medicine Technologist (NMT), when leaving to administer a stress dose in another location, left the hot lab door open and unsecured, which contained a used Tc-99 rest dose, waste materials, and sealed sources containing 0.5 uCl of Cs-137 and 10.2 mCl of Co-57. This is a Severity Level IV violation (Enforcement Policy 6.7.d)

Corrective actions included the supervisor reiterating with the NMT that the hot lab must be secured anytime it is not supervised.

2. 10 CFR 30.34(b)(1) requires that no license issued or granted pursuant to the regulations in this part and parts 31 through 36, and 39 nor any right under a license shall be transferred, assigned or in any manner disposed of, either vo untarily or involuntarily, directly or indirectly, through transfer of control of any license to any person, unless the Commission shall, after securing full information, find that the transfer is in accordance with the provisions of the Act and shall give its consent in writing.

Contrary to the above, on October 1, 2018, Wetzel County Hospital underwent a transfer of control of the NRC radioactive materials license to another entity before the Commission found that the transfer was in accordance with the provisions of the Act and gave its consent in writing. Specifically, Wetzel County Hospital entered into a management agreement with West Virginia University Hospitals, Inc. (WVUH) which provides for CEO services and support to Wetzel County Hospital.

This is a Severity Level IV violation (Enforcement Policy Example 6.3.d.7).

Corrective actions included submitting documentation for the transfer of control for NRC approval and giving a verbal commitment to notify the NRC in writing of any future transfers of control.
