Dear Mr. Pate:

This letter refers to the unannounced inspection conducted on February 25 and 28, 2019, at your facility in Casper, Wyoming. The inspection was an examination of activities conducted under your license as they relate to public health and safety, to confirm compliance with the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission's (NRC's) rules, regulations, and with the conditions of your license. Within these areas, the inspection consisted of a selected examination of procedures and representative records, observations of activities, independent radiation measurements and interviews with personnel. The preliminary inspection findings were discussed with you and your staff at the conclusion of the onsite portion of the inspection on February 28, 2019. A final exit briefing was conducted telephonically with your radiation safety officer on April 19, 2019.

Based on the results of the inspection, one or more violations of NRC requirements were identified. The violations were evaluated in accordance with the NRC Enforcement Policy, which can be found at the NRC's Web site at http://www.nrc.gov/about-nrc/regulatory/enforcement/enforce-pol.html. The violation(s) involved NRC security requirements and are discussed and cited in the non-public Notice of Violation (Notice) contained in the Enclosure to this letter. The circumstances surrounding the violation(s), the significance of the issues, and the need for lasting and effective corrective actions were discussed with you on February 28, 2019. The violation(s) are being cited because they were identified by the NRC during the inspection.

You are required to respond to this letter and should follow the instructions specified in the enclosed Notice when preparing your response. The guidance in NRC Information Notice 96-28, "Suggested Guidance Relating to Development and Implementation of Corrective Action," may be helpful in preparing your response.
