Enclosed is Amendment No. 39 to your NRC Material License No. 13-05605-01 in accordance with your request.

This amendment was prepared using our new Web Based Licensing System (WBL). This has resulted in changes to your license including the deletion of Condition No. 13, as it appeared on Amendment No. 38 and the addition of an ADAMS accession number to the document listed in renumbered Condition No. 13 to Amendment No. 39.

10 CFR Part 71, while no longer referenced by Condition on your license, is now included by reference in the Preamble language at the top of page 1 of your license.

We also changed the suffix for your name, as we do not list terminal degrees at the bachelor's level. We retained your certification abbreviation, however.

We noted that the letterhead used for your amendment request dated March 22, 2019, shows that the Post Office Box for your address is "2349." We show the Post Office Box for your address as "490."

If your Post Office Box has changed, please request an amendment to your license to effect this change upon receipt of this letter. This will be necessary to ensure that you continue to receive all NRC correspondence to maintain your license. Please reference your amendment request as "additional information to control no. 611770" and address it to my attention at the address above.

We updated the authorization for Michael J. Malnofski, M.D. where his restriction for the use of materials in 10 CFR 35.300 is concerned. It now reads: "10 CFR 35.100, 35.200 and 35.300 (limited to the oral administration of sodium iodide I-131 for diagnostic studies."

If you or Dr. Malnofski have any questions concerning this change, please contact me as specified below.

You will be periodically inspected by NRC. Failure to conduct your program in accordance with NRC regulations, license conditions, and representations made in your license application and supplemental correspondence with NRC will result in enforcement action against you.

This could include issuance of a notice of violation, or imposition of a civil penalty, or an order suspending, modifying or revoking your license as specified in the General Statement of Policy and Procedure for NRC Enforcement Actions.


