LICENSEE:

The inspection was an examination of the activities conducted under your license as they relate to radiation safety and to compliance with the Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) rules and regulations and the conditions of your license. The inspection consisted of selective examinations of procedures and representative records, interviews with personnel, and observations by the inspector. The inspection findings are as follows:

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10 CFR 30.34(i) states that each portable gauge licensee shall use a minimum of two independent physical controls that form tangible barriers to secure portable gauges from unauthorized removal, whenever portable gauges are not under the control and constant surveillance of the licensee.

Contrary to the above, the licensee failed to use a minimum of two independent physical controls that form tangible barriers to secure portable gauges from unauthorized removal, whenever portable gauges are not under the control and constant surveillance of the licensee. Specifically on April 10, 2019, the licensee stored a portable gauge in an intermodal container that had one lock on the door, the transportation case was double locked, but the lock on the intermodal container was the only barrier preventing unauthorized removal of the gauge in the transportation case.

The licensee immediately added a chain and lock securing the gauge case to the intermodal container. As a comprehensive corrective action, the RSO committed to training applicable staff on the requirement.

This a severity level IV violation (Enforcement Policy 6.3)
