Scott/Eric,

Ok great. The meeting will be in building One of the White Flint North complex. I'll meet you lobby once through security to escort you to the room. As for security, I'll put your names in the system to help the process go a little faster but please arrive ahead of time (~30 to ~20 mins) prior to allow time to get through security and bring you up to the conference room – right after lunch can get busy some days depending on what other meetings are going on. If you happen to make it through quickly and have extra time, your visitor badge will allow you (without needing an escort) to use the restrooms and the cafeteria just down the hall to your right when you get in.

As for the security process, if you haven't been here before, or its been a while, its similar to an airport. You'll need a valid form of ID (driver's license works), you'll have to go through a metal detector and any bags will go through an scanner. I wasn't able to find a formal list of what is prohibited but it's generally common sense stuff – no items which could cause property damage or personal injury; no firearms, explosives, or incendiary devices.

The address for One White Flint North is 11555 Rockville Pike, Rockville MD 20852 (picture below, building on the left). As for parking, there is some street parking near the building on Marinelli Road that has parking meters but availability could be limited at that time. Also down Marinelli Road, just past the NRC buildings, is the White Flint Metro Parking Garage which usually has plenty of spots available. According to the [DC Metro website](#), the parking cost should be \$8.75.

Hello Mr. Epstein and Mr. Portzline,

The Petition Review Board (PRB) that was selected to consider your 2.206 Petition regarding Three Mile Island Nuclear Station, Unit 1 steam generator tube-to-tube wear has performed its initial assessment of your petition. The result is that your petition does not meet the following NRC Management Directive MD 8.11 Section III.C.1 criteria for petition evaluation:

- (b) The petition falls within one of the following categories:*
(i) The issues raised by the petitioner have not previously been the subject of a facility-specific or generic NRC staff review, or

Specifically, the NRC has been involved with this issue since it was first identified in 2011. Documents that you referred to in your petition as well as other publicly available documents reflect the NRC staff's detailed knowledge of the tube wear issue and the NRC staff's position.

Consistent with NRC Management Directive MD 8.11 Section III.F, I would like to offer you meeting with the PRB to clarify or supplement your petition based on the results of the PRB's initial assessment. Please reply to let me know within 1 week whether or not you will meet with the PRB.

Hello Mr. Portzline,

I understand that a co-worker of mine, Perry Buckberg, previously reached out to you, letting you know that the petition had been received by the NRC. I'm writing to let you know that I have been assigned as the Petition Manager for the 10 CFR 2.206 Petition you submitted to the NRC on March 11, 2019, regarding your concerns about the design of the replacement steam generators at Three Mile Island Nuclear Station, Unit 1 (TMI).

Specifically you state that the analysis and testing used to confirm the design of the steam generators was insufficient when it came to identifying steam tube fluttering, and due to this, TMI is in violation of 10 CFR 50.59 and that the plant appears to be at a significant increased risk of an accident. Due to your concerns, your petition requests enforcement action, including shutting down the reactor, until the problem is properly evaluated and remediated.

In the 10 CFR 2.206 process, information related to the petition generally is made public, including your identity. Since we knew that you had made the public aware of your submittal via a press advisory, press conference, and posted it on your website, we made your submittal publicly available in our document collection system (ADAMS).

I'll be keeping you informed as to the status of the NRC's review of the petition throughout the process. I have provided the following links to our [Management Directive](#) and [Desktop Guide](#) which layout the process the NRC staff will follow. Even if you have used the 2.206 process in the past, I recommend taking a look since the process has recently been updated.
