
Dear Frank P. D. Tran:


## Corporate Radiation Safety Officer Delegation of Authority

The management of Beaumont Health System appoints Sheila Shaffer, MS. as the Corporate Radiation Safety Officer, who agrees to be responsible for implementing the radiation protection program and conditions specified under NRC License (21-01333-01). The management of Beaumont Health System grants the Corporate Radiation Safety Officer and the Radiation Safety Committee authority, organizational freedom, and management prerogative to:

- 1) Identify radiation safety problems;
- 2) Initiate, recommend, or provide corrective actions; and
- 3) Verify implementation of corrective actions.

The Corporate Radiation Safety Officer has the authority to immediately stop any operations involving the use of radioactive material in which health and safety may be compromised or may result in non-compliance with NRC requirements.
