
As you may know, the House Subcommittee on Transportation and Commerce, which I chair, has legislative jurisdiction over the transportation and disposal of hazardous materials.

I am, of course, deeply concerned about the continuing dangers associated with the nuclear accident at the Three Mile Island Plant in Middleton, Pennsylvania. It is my understanding that after the plant has cooled down sufficiently, plans and procedures for removing, transporting and final disposal of the nuclear waste material will have to be implemented.

Pursuant to this subcommittee's oversight responsibility in regard to the transportation and disposal of hazardous waste, please be advised that we wish to be informed on a continuing basis as these plans are formulated, analyzed and implemented.
