Dear Dr. Hendrie:

A front page news item in the 9 August 1979 issue of The Lincoln County News quotes portions of a letter to you requesting extended shutdown of the Maine Yankee Atomic power plant.

The news item apparently identifies Tom Trowbridge as Director of Civilian Emergency Preparedness in Edgecomb; erroneously indicates that Edgecomb has no emergency evacuation plan; and requests the shutdown of Maine Yankee. The above statements are not true.

As you know, CEP is not a political agency; and does not advocate causes. Its purpose at the community level is to act as emergency planner and coordinator for local elected officials in time of disaster of any kind, whether storm, nuclear, or other man-made.

Also, the town of Edgecomb has had an emergency operations plan and an adequate evacuation plan since 1977. The plans are State approved; and are continuously being updated.

Accordingly, we request that you ignore any reference to the town of Edgecomb that may be contained in the letter to you requesting shutdown of Maine Yankee Atomic.
