RE: Memorandum of Agreement of August 20, 1979, Source Material License to Energy Fuels Nuclear, Inc.

Dear Mr. Scarano:

In our letter of May 3, 1979, we indicated that we had some reservations concerning mitigation. Since the memorandum of agreement has been signed without State Historic Preservation Officer signature, we feel it is necessary again to relay our concerns.

- Under I(a) it states that "sites that will ultimately be located within one hundred feet of the perimeter of the reclaimed tailings impoundment area are considered unavoidable and shall be recovered through archeological excavation." This may be an unnecessary measure, since excavation will disturb sites which may not be impacted. We would recommend avoidance before recovery.
- 2. I(b) This paragraph is somewhat unclear in intent. It seems to indicate that all archeological sites (on Table A) that are of undetermined elgibility would be tested. This would be an unnecessary adverse effect. Sites should only be tested if they are to be impacted under site specific plans.
- 3. I(i) Recovery of all sites in the stockpile area is not necessary since selected sites might be avoided, thus preserving them for future recovery. Additionally, the recovery to be completed by December 31, 1982, may set an unreasonable barrier on when recovery should take place.
