Gentlemen:

By letter dated September 8, 1977, you committed to performing periodic vibration testing and ultrasonic inspection of the shafts of the decay heat pumps at Three Mile Island Nuclear Station Unit No. 1 (TMI-1). This commitment was made at the request of the staff in order to provide assurance of continued shaft integrity pending our review of metallurgical and systems data relating to the cause of the failure of a similar shaft at Crystal River Unit No. 3. The commitment also constituted an acceptable alternative to prompt disassembly and inspection of the TMI-1 shafts using direct visual techniques.

By letter dated November 10, 1977, you stated that you did not intend to perform further shaft testing which would require uncoupling of the shaft. Per telecon between Mr. G. B. Zwetzig of the NRC and Mr. Ron Stevens of your staff, it was determined that your statement meant that Met Ed intended to discontinue the ultrasonic inspection committed to in their letter of September 8, 1977.

This is to advise you that we have not concluded our review of this issue and therefore have no basis for concluding that termination of periodic ultrasonic inspection of these shafts is acceptable. Moreover, meither in your letter of November 10, 1977, nor in other correspondence do you provide an acceptable basis for terminating such ultrasonic inspection. Accordingly, we do not concur with termination of the periodic ultrasonic examination of the decay heat pump shafts at this time. In this regard, however, we are currently considering your request to change the frequency for ultrasonic inspection of the decay heat pump shafts from a monthly basis to a quarterly basis. Our determination in this regard, if found acceptable, will be the subject of separate correspondence.
