REVIEW OF ALAB-531 (MATTER OF PORTLAND GENERAL ELECTFIC COMPANY, ET AL.)

Trojan Nuclear Plant (Proposed Amendment to Permit Storage Pool Modification)

To inform the Commission of an Appeal Board decision on which two petitions for review have been received and which, in my opinion, present significant generic issues.

Extended by Order of the Secretary.

On March 21, 1979, the Appeal Board affirmed a Licensing Board decision that permitted an increase in the storage capacity of the spent fuel pool at the Trojan facility. See LBP-78-32, 8 MRC 413 (1978). The Appeal Board's decision, ALAB-531, dealt with three major questions: whether the licensing Board was correct in concluding that no environmental impact statement for pool capacity expansion or examination of alternatives was necessary, whether the Commission's five-point standard for interim spent fuel storage libensing in the absence of a generic environmental statement was correctly applied, and whether sertain conditions on the Irojan storage tool operation ought to be made part of the technical specifications included in the plant operating license. Sefore us on appeal is of the Licensing Board autho license for the Trojan nucle

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413. The amendment would permit the expansion of the capacity of the facility's spent fuel pool by means of the installation of new spent fuel storage racks with space for 651 fuel assemblies in place of the existing racks which can accommodate 280 fuel assemblies.

I.

In the context of a number of contentions raised by the parties, the Licensing Board examined the environmental impacts which would be associated with the expansion of the capacity of the spent fuel pool. On the basis of that examination, it found that those impacts would be local in character and "insignificant" in extent. 8 NRC at 438-446.

Accordingly, the Board concluded, the staff had correctly determined that an environmental impact statement

SPECIFICATIONS

In considering whether to review the Appeal Board's decision in ALAB-531, the Commission noted that the State of Oregon has raised a major issue concerning the appropriate standard in the regulations to describe what subjects must be included in a licensee's technical specifications and thus become part of the license. This is an important issue that affects all facilities and licensing actions and requires attention by the Commission. Rather than review the particular adjudication, the Commission has decided to explore this issue in a more generic fashion. Accordingly, the staff is directed to brief the Commission on the scope of the issues involved in setting such a standard and possible approaches for implementing that standard. This briefing will be scheduled as soon as practicable.
