I am a citizen who has become belatedly aware of the dangers of the use of nuclear energy for the generation of electricity.

I live in South Beloit, Illinois thirty miles north of Byron, Illinois, where Con Ed is presently building a nuclear energy plant. I did not say anything, or go to the public hearings, when the plant in Byron first came under consideration. I regret this now. And wonder what I can do, as a citizen, to put up two cents worth in, about its opening or closing. Does in short citizen participation end with the first public hearings? What can I do to make sure what happened at the Three Island nuclear plant doesn't happen here, as a result of some unforeseen defect, or chemical reaction, or human error in the running of the future nuclear plant in Byron, Illinois?
