Gentlemen:

In response to the subject, we are planning to comply with your expectations in the following fashion:

1. We have been, and expect to continue, using the services of Teledyne Isotopes, 50 Van Buren Avenue, Westwood, N.J. 07675, for disposal of radioactive wastes.
2. We have been receiving, and expect to continue to receive periodic up-dates on packaging requirements from Teledyne. Those requirements have been, and will continue to be transmitted to those of our personnel involved in packaging radioactive wastes.
3. The Radiation Protection Officer, Stanley L. Harrison, is responsible for the safe packaging of radioactive waste, and maintenance of records of all shipments of such waste to burial sites.
4. Prior to February, 1979, all radioactive wastes were buried on site, in compliance with pertinent Federal and State regulations. On February 14, 1979, a single shipment of wastes was disposed of by Teledyne Isotopes. That shipment consisted of six 30 gallon and three 55 gallon drums, each containing approximately 100  $\mu$ Ci of  $^{14}$ C-activity. One 55 gallon drum contained scintillation liquids in vials; the remainder of the drums contained solid wastes.
