active Waste for Transport and Burial"

Dear Mr. Boyce:

In response to your letter dated November 1, 1979,
I did not receive the I.E. Bulletin 79-19 which you sent.
I now wish to comply with your requests for information.

Quinnipiac College has not generated low level radio-
active waste requiring packaging and transport for burial
at least since January 1, 1978. The very low level radio-
active waste which we have generated is water soluble pre-
parations of tritiated steroid. Our procedures for diluting
these wastes and introducing them into our sewage system
was reviewed with Myu A. Campbell, your inspector, who
checked our facilities in the Summer of 1978. Right up
to the present date this is our only generation of radio-
active waste and our precautions are still carefully main-
tained as before.

Nevertheless, I have worked through the requirements
of the above-mentioned I.E. Bulletin 79-19 and have made
a file for future use. This information is available to
you on request.

It is my intention to respond promptly to your inquiries.
However, because of our summer staff arrangements from mid-
June through to the end of August, communications received
at that time occasionally are misdirected. Your patience
is acknowledged and appreciated.
