
To whom it may concern:

The purpose of this letter is to advise you of the intention of West Virginia University Hospitals, Inc. ("WVUH") to replace the existing membership to become the sole member of Community Health Association d/b/a Jackson General Hospital ("JGH"), a member-based non-profit corporation (the "WVUH Transaction"). In accordance with 10 C.F.R. §§ 30.34 and 70.36, JGH and WVUH jointly request the consent of the Nuclear Regulatory Commission ("NRC") to the change of control of Material License No. 47-17058-01 from JGH to WVUH. The projected closing date for this transaction is April 30, 2019.

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

Under the terms of the Agreement, Community Health Association d/b/a Jackson General Hospital will be required to obtain approval by the NRC for the change of control in the licensed nuclear material to West Virginia University Hospitals, Inc.

There will be no changes in location, facilities, equipment, or procedures that relate to the licensed program. There will be no changes in the name of the licensee. The only change is the sole member of the licensee—West Virginia University Hospitals, Inc.

4. Describe the status of the licensee's facilities, equipment, and radiation safety program, including any known contamination and whether decontamination will occur prior to transfer. Include the status of calibrations, leak tests, area surveys, wipe tests, training, quality control, and related records.

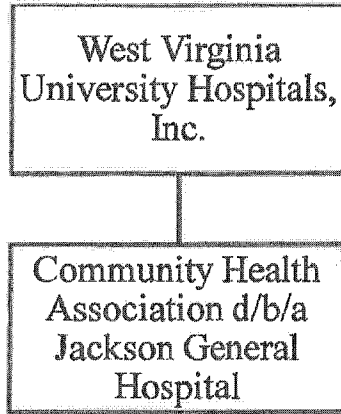
