Summary of Commitments, Conclusions, and Agreements:

- 1. The plant site, plant and environs of the facility were toured.
- The applicant's responses to NRC staff questions and clarification requests of April 16, 1979, were reviewed and discussed.
- The NRC staff found the responses and clarifications of April 30, 1979, to be adequate.

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- 4. The proposed NRC license conditions for the intended operation were reviewed and elaborated upon by the NRC staff. The applicant found the proposed conditions to be acceptable based upon his initial review. However, if after a suita le period of operation and data generation by the applicant it is determined that any of the license conditions are considered to be superfluous, he may request amendment of such conditions.
- 5. NRC staff will supply the applicant with copies of relevant parts of Title 10, Code of Federal Regulations (10 CFR), for his proposed operation and other relevant NRC branch position papers and regulatory guides.
- 6. The applicant will obtain pertinent documents in the Public Document Room (PDR) that are applicable to his proposed operation, e.g., Wyoming Mineral Corporation's Docket File No. 40-8585, for his information and file.
- 7. The NRC staff estimated that this licensing action would be processed by mid-June, 1979.
- 8. The applicant has filed for the necessary state and local permits required for the proposed operation. Copies of these documents will be submitted to the NPC upon their receipt by the applicant from the agencies.
